- If the linkage guard is to be install on a skid plate that is already install on a bike, remove the skid plate from the bike.
- If your skid plate doesn't already have the
 Linkage Guard holes, cut out the supplied
 template, align the template with the
 back edge of the skid plate. If your skid
 plate has a spacer place template as shown in (Fig.1)
- Now mark the two holes that need to be drilled in the skid plate. (Fig.2)
- 4 Using the supplied ¼" drill, drill the two marked holes. (Fig.3)
- Mount the linkage guard using the supplied M6x12 hex head bolts, dished washers and the M6 Nylock nut as shown in (Fig.4a & 4b)
