

PREPARATION

1. Place motorcycle securely on its side stand.

2. Remove the two fender strut screws and washers from one side of the motorcycle. This hardware will not be reused. (6mm Hex Wrench) Figure 1

INSTALLATION

1. Select the Right side Eyebrow Plate (4) from Kit.

2. Prepare Front and Rear Hardware Assemblies as shown in **Figure 2**.

Rear Assembly


Screw (10) Cover (9) Rear Spool (7) with Black Cushion installed from factory Rear Spacer (5) Front Assembly Screw (10) Front Spool (8) Front Spacer (6)

3. Install the Eyebrow Plate (4) to the Right fender using the Front and Rear Hardware Assemblies. (6mm Hex Wrench) Figure 3 and 4

4. Repeat procedure on Left side of motorcycle.

5. Tighten the 4, M8 x 45 Screws (10) to 18 ft/lbs (216 in/lbs), (24 N-m). (Hex Key, 6mm) Figure 3 and 4

6. Side Plate (1) and (2) installation is completed when installing the Backrest P9800A or Luggage Rack P9900 components.

MAINTENANCE

The high quality chrome finish of your Paladin rack assembly can be maintained with any quality chrome cleaner and or polish.

Using the QuickSet 3® feature to remove your Paladin System.

Check that QuickSet 3 is unlocked. Stand at the rear of the motorcycle and grab ahold of the system at the side plates. Lift up on the QuickSet 3 lever while rotating the system up and pull back and out of the forward guide washer.

For re-installation, first make sure the QuickSet 3 feature is unlocked. Holding the system as you do in removal, guide the side plate into the forward guide washer. Make sure you fully seat the notch of the side plate into the washer. Lift the Quickset 3 lever and guide the rear notch in the side plate back onto the rear guide washer.

When mounting the luggage rack or backrest assembly, listen for the audibile "click" indicating that the latches are in place and side plate is completly seated onto guide washers.

Maximum load for the Luggage Rack is 5 Kg (11 lbs).

When mounting the Backrest assembly, listen for the audible "click" indicating that the latches are in place. Always lock the QuickSet 3® Side Mount Plate before using your motorcycle. This insures the utmost in safety.

Never ride your motorcycle with loose accessory mounting hardware. Check the hardware for tightness regularly.

Today's motorcycles are built with enough frame rigidity to withstand the moderate loads imposed on them by the foreseeable addition of an accessory. If the accessory(ies) adversely affects your motorcycle's stability, immediately remove the accessory(ies). Do not ride a motorcycle that exhibits unsafe handling traits.

Have experienced service personnel correct any problem before riding with the accessory(ies) installed. For further questions concerning handling problems associated with an accessory(ies), contact your dealer, motorcycle manufacturer, or accessory manufacturer.
